

International Society for Self & Identity 2022 Mini Research Grant Program

ISSI is pleased to announce a call for proposals for the 2022 Mini Research Grant Program. This program is aimed at providing research support for current Ph.D. students and people who have received their Ph.D. within the last 10 years in the areas of self and identity, broadly defined. We will award up to 3 mini grants at a maximum of \$1,000 each. The award funds are to be used to cover research expenses after the fact (i.e., the research should not have been conducted already, but the grant funds can only be used to reimburse documented, already-paid-for expenses). Examples of appropriate research expenses are participant compensation via online data collection platforms (e.g., MTurk, Prolific, CloudResearch), research-related equipment, software, etc. Salary- and travel-related expenses cannot be reimbursed. Criteria for funding are: (a) Soundness of research question, design, and planned analysis; and (b) relevance and significance of research to the field of self and identity. ELIGIBILITY AND RULES:

1. Must be currently enrolled in a Ph.D. program or be within 10 years of receiving your Ph.D. with an academic appointment (non-tenured or tenured, including postdoctoral positions) at an educational institution.
2. All applicants must be members of ISSI for 2023 (membership fees are \$10 for students and \$20 for faculty). [Join ISSI here: http://www.issiweb.org/membership/](http://www.issiweb.org/membership/).
3. Graduate students must provide a brief letter of support from your advisor indicating their acknowledgment and support of the project for which you are applying for research funds. Letters of support may be no more than 1 page maximum and must be in PDF format with the name of the PI in the file name.
4. The research project for which you're requesting funds must not be already complete.
5. You must submit your completed application (see application details below) via [this Google form](#) by this year's **deadline** of midnight of **Saturday, October 15, 2022**.

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS ([VIA GOOGLE FORM](#)):

1. Brief 100 word abstract.
2. Articulate the main research question/hypothesis of the study, its design and methodology, and planned analyses. This can include discussion of the significance of the project, including potential impact to the discipline/field/society (250 words maximum)
3. Please provide information about participants (e.g. number to be recruited, relevant power analysis, special population considerations) (150 words max).
4. Describe the relevance and significance of your proposed research to the field of self and identity (no more than 150 words).
5. Brief budget and justification outlining what the research funds will be used to cover (no more than 150 words).
6. CV in PDF format – Label the file with the name of the PI.
